

What to do if your child is absent.

What to do if your child is late for school.

Secondary School Applications

The online application process opened on the 1st September 2021. Y6 parents/ carers will be receiving open evening information for all local secondary schools. This

information can also be found online. Applications for Year 7 places starting in September 2021 can be submitted from the 1 September 2021- 31 October 2021.

Primary School Applications

To apply for a primary school place for September 2022 please read the information below.

- The application opens on 1 September 2021
- The closing date to submit your application is 15 January 2022

You can choose up to six schools for your child to attend - <u>see your nearest primary</u>

You can see how primary school places were allocated in previous years

If you do not pay Council Tax in Harrow you will need to provide <u>documents</u> <u>to confirm your address</u>

Any applications submitted after 15 January 2022 will be considered late and will be processed in April 2022.

Nursery Applications

You can apply for a nursery school place for September 2022, if your child was born between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019.

Your child can attend nursery either in the mornings or the afternoons or the option of 30 hours and flexi time is available at some nurseries. You can let us know which option is suitable for you during your application.

Closing date for applications

The closing date for applications to be processed in the main round is 15 January 2022. Any applications submitted after 15 January 2022 are considered late and will be processed after 15 March 2022.

If you want to submit a late application, please complete the application form.

Receiving the outcome of your application

If you submitted your application before 15 January 2022, you will receive a letter advising of the outcome of your application on 15 March 2022.

If you made a late application (after 15 January 2022) the nursery school will contact you with the outcome of your application. If you do not receive an outcome from the nursery school within a couple of weeks of submitting the application, please contact the nursery directly.

Immediate nursery school places

If you need a nursery school place for the current academic year please contact the nursery school directly.

Do you think you may qualify for Free School Meals? If yes please apply through Harrow council or speak to the school office

Apply for free school meals

To apply for free school meals your child has to attend a Harrow school and be aged between 5 and 18 years. Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

Income Support

income-based Jobseeker's Allowance


income-related Employment and Support Allowance

support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

the guaranteed element of Pension Credit

Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)

Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get) Year 6 had a visit from Transport for London (TfL). They learnt about staying safe whilst using public transport. This was particularly useful to them as many will be travelling independently to high school next academic year.
