Over the last few weeks, we have really got into the Christmas spirit and celebrated together, with you, our traditional Dressing the Tree assembly, enjoyed the fantastic Christmas Fair and watched our talented Reception children perform the Christmas Nativity to a busy hall of children and parents. Thank you for supporting us with donations and your attendance at these events.

In the Autumn 1 newsletter, Ms Graham mentioned some exciting curriculum developments currently taking place at Earlsmead Primary. The curriculum team have been hard at work redesigning our curriculum maps to appeal to our wonderful children and our unique locality. Curriculum changes are taking place and we want to share the journey with our families:

When learning about WW2 in Y6, how wonderful would it be to link learning to the Northolt RAF base and its role in WW2?



When learning about significant people in Y1s '*Blast Off*!' topic, let's recognise the achievements of Dr Nicholas Patrick, a Harrow-educated former NASA astronaut!



Knowledge Mats are now being used across history and geography topics taught, and will be enrolled across all subjects in time. These mats summarise key facts and essential knowledge, along with sticky vocabulary essential for a topic. The children are provided with opportunities to retrieve this knowledge over time – this is called spaced retrieval. Why not ask your children on a Friday one thing they learnt in their topic that week?

More curriculum developments will follow but until then, the staff at Earlsmead would like to wish you all a restful break; we look forward to welcoming the children back to school on Thursday 5th January 2023. Wishing you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year ahead.






Year 3 Stone Age Cave Drawings







Nursery have been reading the story "Kipper's Birthday."






We made party hats and birthday cards.








Winter Wonderland Fair
