Dear Parents, Carers and Community,


I hope that all of you have enjoyed the parent information meetings this week with your children's class teachers. I know from experience that parents love looking through their children's books (almost as much as children love showing them). This can also be a really useful lever for advice about how parents and carers can help at home. Please do try to read with your child every day – reading is the gateway to all other learning!

I recently surveyed parents about services within the school including catering and wrap around care before and after school. If you missed your chance to participate in the survey but would like to share your thoughts, please email directly through to the office (address above). Such emails will be passed on to me and carefully considered, I assure you. We are currently considering if we could extend wrap around care hours but need to ensure there is a need for this to cover costs. Catering costs will rise up to £2.41 (this is set by the catering company, not the school) due to rising costs for supplies. We will also pass on feedback from a recent pupil survey about foods the children like and dislike and portion sizes to the catering company as soon as they are finalised.

We have updated our website calendar and it is also attached to this newsletter with changes coloured in green. There are three more potential strike days coming up though these have not yet been confirmed so keep an eye on Dojo for information. Also, we have tacked an extra day's holiday onto the Easter Break (17th April 2023) so that staff can complete a curriculum planning day. This work is crucial to ensuring your children have an exciting and broad curriculum which is well sequenced and assessed accurately.

As you will see from this newsletter, we have had a very busy start to the Spring term. Some stand out events include the farm animals visiting, mental health Taskmaster for children during Mental Health Week and Number Day. My favourite event was Quest Writing Week – it was great to see the awe and wonder on the children's (and parents') faces when they entered the school and saw all of the decorations. Check out our beautiful hall displays for some amazing writing from the week.

We look forward to welcoming the children back to school on Monday, 20th February. Please have a wonderful and safe half term.


By the end of the wonderful week, every child became an author through planning and writing. Children were not only authors, but skilled illustrators and publishers too!

The children had a great time down on the farm meeting a donkey, Shetland pony, goats, sheep, rabbits, guinea pigs and a variety of ducks and geese.






















Children's Mental Health Week

Miss Cole and Cedar's parents were super impressed with the children's clear and loud speaking in their sharing assembly. They were all so brave and proud to share their learning with the school.










Nursery celebrated the year of the rabbit for Chinese New Year.
