
#### Community

We were all absolutely amazed by the success of our first ever Pi Day here at Earlsmead Primary School. Children from Year 1 through to Year 6 showed unbelievable determination and commitment to learn the digits of Pi. This enthusiasm really paid off as we had some outstanding competition results. Our KS1 winner was Sharbika from Cherry with an impressive 60 digits. In LK2, our winner was Sharvil from Ash with an incredible 102 digits. Finally, Shan from Sycamore in KS2 won with an astonishing 260 digits! Well done to everyone who entered the competition-you should be very proud of yourselves.







#### Science Week

For Science week this year, the theme was *Connections*. The theme prompted children to look at the big and small connections between things in our lives. In Nursery, children looked at how we are connected to farmers, and even tasted some new vegetables! In Year 1 Redwood, they looked for the connections between force and weight by building freestanding bridges. In Y3/4 Manuka, they looked at the connections between each other's fingerprints, and in Y3 Ash they looked at the connections between yeast and sugar!

# Watch Us Grow!








We have planted seeds and tried new vegetables.

Our recent reading this half-term has also been a range of fiction and non-fiction material all about dinosaurs.












## Year 1

Y1 have been very busy indeed! After thought-tracking to better understand the characters from their class text Dogger, they built towers using 3D shapes. They had a great time working collaboratively as well as learning lots along the way. As part of Children's Mental Health Day, the class also used a range of natural materials that they found outside to create their own face pictures. It was a lot of fun! This week, they are excited to be going on their first class trip to Alexanda park. They will be observing seasonal changes and looking at a different trees and plants.













## Year 2

Year 2 and Saplings spent a whole day in RHS Wisely gardens. The children were able to explore the glasshouse, which houses many peculiar plants, including a banana tree, cacti and plants that grow upside down!

Children were also taught all about how plants grow and the life cycle they follow, and will be able to watch this happen by planting their very own seed to take home! They then went on a hunt to see if they could find all the different sections of a plant's life cycle: seed, bud, flower and fruit. A day to remember.











# Year 3 & 4

Y3 Ash presented their learning on Ancient Egypt through their class assembly. The children were confident in sharing what they have learnt so far in this topic. Did you know, King Tutankhamun died and was buried in a tomb when he was around the age of just 18.





Manuka have enjoyed this short but actionpacked half-term. Science Week gave us opportunities to carry out some really interesting investigations including one about our own finger prints - did you know? No two finger prints are the same!

Meranti have been looking at the digestive system in Science. We looked at teeth and what happens to food after we've eaten it. Meranti have made 3D posters showcasing what they've learned.

## Year 5

The children explored Greek pottery and art by first researching Greek lifestyles, art and culture. After our research, we began designing a Greek pot. The children first sketched their ideas through observing real-life Greek pottery. Then they made their own scratch paper to reveal their pot design. They looked great and it was lots of fun! Then we got messy with clay and made a 3D Greek vase.







## Year 6

Year 6 have been investigating the effects of liquid and solid soap in cleaning our hands. The class conducted their experiments using the two forms of soap to wash their hands, handled their slide of bread, which was then sealed. We still patiently await the results of our findings to see which bread is mouldier than the other. The bread with the least amount of mould suggests that form of soap is more effective at cleaning our hands. The wait continues...Additionally, Year 6 conducted an experiment to see how Mint Mentos react to Diet Coke. We witnessed an explosion on the grounds of Earlsmead!

Saplings 1 had great fun on World Book Day. The children dressed up and enjoyed talking about their characters in circle time and answering 'wh' questions from their peers. They also became detectives and completed a book hunt in our school library.






